- In last two years 7.50 lakh trekkers/nature lovers enjoyed pristine beauty of Forests. 1.80 lakh trekkers during first 4 months of current year.

Biodiversity Conservation

- Biodiversity Registers prepared for all 4290 GPs & 78 ULBs
- City Biodiversity index and Local Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan for Srinagar & Jammu cities prepared. 9th and 10th cities in India to do it.
- Biodiversity strategy Action Plan for UT of J&K under preparation.

Major thrust on Forest Protection

- About 450 forest demarcation records updated
- 41120 kanals of encroached forest land evicted
- About 3.1 lakh Cubic feet illicit timber seized
- Seizure of 691 vehicles involved in forest offences
- 62 detentions against habitual forest offenders under Public Safety Act

Ease of living through e-governance

- Four G to B and One G to C services made online through single window portal integrated with RAS
- "One Nation, One Transit Pass" for transparent, hassle-free transportation of forest produce anywhere in India
- E-Way bill under GST is deemed transit pass under Forest Produce Transit Rules
- License validity for Wood Based Industries enhanced to 5 years
- One time registration of furniture units in place of periodical renewals.




Comprehensive restoration measures taken up systematically in the Protected Wetlands of Kashmir, resulted in a record number of migratory birds -13.28 lakh, during February 2023 against 8.25 Lakh in 2020.



Dachigam **National Park** adjudged as the best in management effectiveness evaluation exercise by the WII; Hangulrecorded a population of 289 in March 2023, a 58% increase over the 2015 population. **Hangul Breeding** Centre in Tral, languishing since 2008, revived and completed in

2023.





Other Major Achievements

- The State Forest Corporation Act 1978 was repealed and the Corporation was converted into a Company under Companies Act, 2013.
- Grant of Consent for all Industries made Online integrated with J&K Single Window System.
- Introduced Auto-Renewal of Consent to Establish / Operate for Green Category Industries.
- For Green Category Industries, Consent to Establish is accorded within 10 Days.
- Introduced Auto Generation of Exemption Certificate of White Category Industries.
- Consent to Establish for Start-Ups is being accorded within 10 Days.
- Consent Fee Waived off for all Government Health Care Facilities in 2023.
